In FY24, B-H-K Community Action Agency assisted more than 2,700 individuals through fuel assistance, water assistance, emergency assistance, energy assistance, tax assistance, home weatherization, bus rides, food assistance, in-home programs for seniors, youth recreation, furnace/chimney cleaning assistance, and the operation of the Keweenaw Handicraft Shop in Ahmeek.
