Policy Priorities 2026



Collaborate with member agencies and state administrators to improve and streamline the oversight of Michigan's Community Action Agencies in order to improve performance and outcomes when serving consumers.



Create new state funding streams that increase the resiliency of federal programs operated by Michigan's Community Action Agencies.



Improve the sustainability of funding for Michigan's Weatherization Assistance Program, which provides energy conservation, health, and safety improvements to Michigan homeowners and tenants across the state.



Partner with state agencies like Mi-LEAP and LARA to hasten the opening of new early childhood education facilities to meet growing demand from Michiganders for high-quality, free early childhood education services.



Work to secure funding and policy changes that enable Michiganders in all parts of the state to meet their basic needs, including access to water, food, heating, and cooling so that Michigan families have a solid foundation to build a sustainable, fulfilling life.
